**February 11th: 32nd World Day of the Sick**

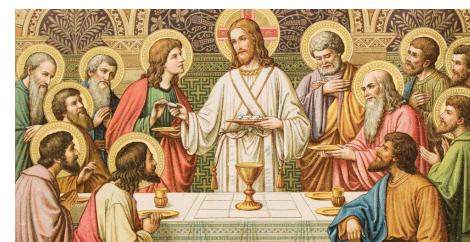

**Jesus is in Capernaum**, the village of the first four disciples. This village, whose name means "village of consolation" or "village of beauty," hosted a synagogue, the ruins of which are still visible. On a Saturday, a day consecrated to rest and listening to the Word of God, Jesus enters and begins to teach. The present ones immediately perceive that his teaching is tangible, his words are full of concreteness and directly connected to their lives. His intention is not to repeat formulas or ideas already elaborated by illustrious teachers but to consider the listeners, making his teaching authentic and personalized. While teaching, a man possessed by a demon begins to speak. He recognizes Jesus' identity and calls him the Holy One of God, emphasizing the distance that should exist between God and the world, a distance that Jesus has eliminated with his birth. Proximity becomes the cause of the demon's ruin, which is defeated not through a struggle but with a simple command: "Be silent! Come out of him!" In this way, Jesus manifests the power of his Word over temptations and the forces that keep man captive.

Now let's analyze the message of these readings as a whole. The word is intrinsic to the human being, and where there are human beings, there are languages; existence is intrinsically dialogical. The word reveals the social dimension of the human being, as it is the place where vital elements such as recognition, affection, discovery, and attention are exchanged, generating relationships. God himself uses this tool to communicate with us. In the Gospel, the Word of Jesus emerges as communication and action simultaneously: he teaches the truth about God and saves, liberating from evil. The believer's task is to adopt a humble attitude of listening, leading to the recognition of inner evil and trusting in the one who, speaking, sets him free. The believer is not the one who possesses much information about God and His Son; rather, he is the one who listens and seeks to live the Word of Jesus." (Fr. D)
