PASTOR'S MESSAGE: CHRIST'S BAPTISM

Christ's Baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River was likely an actual historical event. It is recorded in three Gospels (Matthew, Mark and Luke) and references to it are made in other ancient sources. The versions in Mark and Luke stress the exterior signs associated with the Baptism: the opening of the heavens; the descent of the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove; and the voice from heaven identifying Jesus as God's Son. Matthew's story adds the interior dimension of why the event occurred in the first place. John's Baptism was one of repentance, which stressed moral purity and conversion. As God's Son, Christ had no reason to repent. John recognized the superior status of Jesus and so resisted the request. Christ responded by noting this action was part of God's plan fulfilling all righteousness. Scholars have debated the meaning of this phrase.. Some argue, before his ministry began, Jesus was adopting the way of life associated with John's Baptism; the call to bear good fruit. Others contend Christ's Baptism showed his solidarity with sinners or with John's call to repentance and the imminent arrival of God's Kingdom. These explanations are linked to one of the effects of the Sacrament of Baptism: union with Jesus and his Church. Everyone is a sinner saved from permanent separation from God (caused by sin) through Christ's intervention. At Baptism, a sinner is joined to the death of Jesus which is how the damage caused by sin was overcome. The individual is also linked to the eternal life associated with his resurrection which points toward the final coming of God's Kingdom. As a result, the baptized are called to bear good fruit: to live as people who are conscious of their sinfulness and strive to overcome it but are not held hostage to it. They are also called to live as people of hope: who see Christ's final coming as something which one welcomes. In addition, Baptism makes them part of a community which shares this understanding of life and, although imperfectly, tries to make it present in our world, which desperately needs to experience it.
